

Mills County
Commissioners Court Minutes
August 7, 2025
Workshop – 2:00 pm
No Action Taken – Discussion Only

This regular session of the Mills County Commissioners Court opened in due form of law at 2:00pm in the Mills County Commissioners' Courtroom located at 1011 4th Street, Goldthwaite, Texas 76844.

Present in the Courtroom were Judge Johnson, Commissioners Craig Sullivan, Robert Head, Dale Partin, Jason Williams, County Treasurer Summer Campbell, Deputy Clerk Shawnee Martinez, Sheriff James Jones, Deputy Sheriff Anthony Pool, Melissa Womack, Emergency Management Coordinator, David Shaw and County Attorney Bill Malone.

Meeting called to order: 2:00pm

1. Opening Pledge of Allegiance and Prayer.
2. Audience with Individuals – N/A
3. Budget Workshop – EMC David Shaw presented grant information to the court in which he had applied for. Funds awarded within the next year, there is an acceptance letter that needs to be completed and sent back to the state.

County Attorney Bill Malone spoke about his court coordinator Rebecca Whitt taking on the role of Victims Service Coordinator (SB22) which would be a \$4,000.00 pay increase. County Treasurer Summer Campbell asked the court how they would like to pay the difference to Rebecca Whitt such as supplement or payroll pay due to the funds currently being in a line item only. Commissioners agreed to suggest paying \$4,000.00 out of the payroll budget.

Commissioner Partin and Judge Johnson met with Sante Fe Railroad Company this morning August 7, 2025, and talked about railroad crossings, agreed to possibly provide traffic cones and (RAP) Reclaimed Asphalt Pavement for the finished product. Charles Miles presented Mills County tax rate but questioned the Voter Approval rate line, he will be reaching out to get clarification and get back to the court with the updated information. Commissioner Partin addressed county road 189, stating it has been classified as a safety hazard by County Attorney, and has asked to move \$220,000.00 in budget for repairs to the road in Precinct #3.

Commissioner Sullivan began talking about his precinct line items and suggested changes of increase and decrease. Sheriff Jones stated there is no changes to the budget he asked for due to it being a conservative amount, there is no room for decreases. Request remains the same.

4. Adjournment - Motion to adjourn made by Judge Johnson with a second from Commissioner Head.
